Please Note: The Lenten Prayer of St. Ephrem the Syrian.

The Prayer of St. Ephraim can be a beautiful addition to your family's Lenten discipline. I encourage you to make it part of your Evening Prayers each night. In each family, evening prayers might look like this.

- O Lord and Master of my life! Take from me the spirit of sloth, despair, lust for power and for idle talk.

- But give rather the spirit of chastity, humility, patience and love to Thy servant.

- Yea, O Lord and King! Grant me to see my own transgressions and not to judge my Brother; for Blessed art Thou, unto ages of ages. Amen.

Please Note: Church Etiquette or Some Things You Should Know While in Church by Fr. David Barr

In the Eastern Church, there are many customs and traditions that are important parts of our worship. Some are cultural; some are pious customs. Some are essential; some are not. From time-to-time, we need to address some of these various etiquette issues to inform our communities how we can best understand each other and work

together to worship the all-holy Trinity. When should you definitely stand? Always during the Gospel reading, the Little and Great Entrances, the Anaphora, the distribution of Holy Communion, whenever the priest gives a blessing, and the Dismissal. In many parishes, the Divine Liturgy books in the pew have suggested times when sitting is acceptable. Follow those instructions (it's probably safer than to follow what the people are doing in the first couple of rows). When in doubt, stand. It is never wrong to stand in church. Lighting Candles: Lighting candles is an important part of worship. We light them as we pray, making an offering to accompany our prayers. Typically light candles when coming into the church - and that is usually the best time to light them, unless you've arrived after Liturgy has begun. There are times when candles should not be lit. It is not proper to light candles during the Epistle or Gospel readings, during the Little or Great Entrances, the sermon, and most of the times when the faithful are standing. If you find yourself arriving to church after the Liturgy has begun, it's best to wait until after the Final Blessing to light a candle.
